





# Consent Form Youth Age 13-19 Photo/Video/Artwork for Public Communication

The First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC), the First Nations Schools Association (FNSA) and the Indigenous Adult and Higher Learning Association (IAHLA) appreciate having photos, videos, and artwork to use in our public communication, and to share with the organizations we partner with.

These photographs, videos and artwork are an important part of our efforts to spread information about First Nations schools, Aboriginal-controlled institutions, and First Nations education more broadly, and to promote and support the provision of quality education to First Nations learners in BC.

## Collection, Use, Disclosure and Sharing

FNESC/FNSA/IAHLA is seeking your consent to collect, use and disclose photographs, videos, images (artwork) of your child with their names for purposes including:

- As part of FNESC/FNSA/IAHLA publications, public communications, reporting and promotional materials such
  as newsletters, brochures (incl. for events), posters, presentations or annual reports;
- As part of parent, student or teacher/school resources, including material for related clubs;
- On FNESC/FNSA/IAHLA websites and/or social media accounts, and printed support materials.

FNESC/FNSA/IAHLA may share the photographs, videos, images (artwork) for purposes consistent with those described:

- To other organizations with which we partner for advanced quality education for all First Nations learners;
- To third party communication contractor we engage to process the information on our behalf and under our instructions.

#### **Right to Withdraw Consent**

Parental/youth consent is valid until revoked. The parent/guardian/youth may revoke consent at any time by contacting FNESC's Privacy Officer at <a href="mailto:privacy@fnesc.ca">privacy@fnesc.ca</a>. The photographs, videos, images (artwork) will not be used, disclosed or shared for new public communication.

#### **Privacy and Safeguards**

FNESC/FNSA/IAHLA are subject to the BC Personal Information Protection Act (PIPA) and take serious their obligation to protect the privacy of you and your child. They have implemented physical, organizational and technological measures to protect the information and ensure the use, disclosure and sharing are appropriate in the circumstances and consistent with the purposes described above.
